

# Understanding the Sexual Exploitation and Associated Sexual Harm of Children and Young People

## Five day short course

**Overview:** This five day course is delivered by staff from the award-winning International Centre: Researching child sexual exploitation, violence and trafficking at the University of Bedfordshire.

The course runs over five days. It is participative in nature, encouraging students to learn from one another as well as the academic team. The teaching draws on contemporary research, policy and practice learning to increase students' understanding of, and ability to effectively engage with, the issue of child sexual exploitation. Key areas covered within this include:

- The 2017 CSE Guidance;
- Definition and interpretation;
- Different forms of CSE;
- Prevention;
- Identification and risk assessment;
- Involving young people as partners in protection;
- Addressing perpetration;
- Adopting a contextual safeguarding approach.

There are two possible modes of engagement:

- Without assignment – receive certificate of attendance
- With assignment – receive 15 Masters credits, upon successful completion of assignment.
