Young People and Peer groups	Young people have a positive identity in the context	We ran a survey with the young people and they said that they think teachers and staff in the school look down on them because of their status and nationality.	Adults in the school will actively promote ways to connect with the young people and promote their identity. Young people will tell us that things have changed.	The school staff are now aware of how the young people and their families. They are reflecting on their own methods of working with the young people and their families and about using more inclusive language. We re-ran the survey with young people and we have very different results. Young people said that they feel much more understood and welcomed now in the school.
Environmental and Community	Young people and adults feel happy and safe in the context because it is used for positive reasons	Young people tell us that they worry about their safety, about being injured or killed in this context. Young people are being seriously injured in this context and one person has died.		Youth workers have started running fun and interesting activities for young people in the context. Lots of people come along and the workers have started to get to know the young people. The young people told them that they feel safer. Some local businesses have been trained by youth workers in deescalation and have started to use this to help support young people when tensions arise. A nearby sports facility is promoting itself as a safe space for young people and young people have started to use it.
