- Summarise information about any previous episodes of Children's Social Care involvement
- Services that are currently involved and impact they are having.

#### **Diversity and Identity**

How have diversity and identity needs been considered as part of this assessment? Consider familial and extra familial (i.e. peer group identity) issues.

### Child development / Child's views and experiences

Relevant information in relation to health, emotional and behavioural development, education, family relationships and social/peer relationships. Consider risk of harm inside and outside the home.

### **Environmental and neighbourhood factors**

Relevant information in relation to living conditions, the impact of the local environment, housing, employment status, finance, legal status, and use of community resources. Consider any risks related to any specific locations that the family and young person spend time in.

#### Parenting capacity/Parenting assessment

Relevant information in relation to basic care, ensuring safety inside and outside the home, emotional warmth, stimulation, guidance and boundaries, stability.
